Long Beach. If one thing has become clear to me since September, it
is that we are all in this togeth-

er. WSNIMA has to help our members and viceversa.

I have always felt that the relationship has to benefit the lodges more than the association. If WSNIMA was shut down tomorrow, the lodges would go on, maybe with more pitfalls than they have now, but they would go on. If the lodges ceased to exist tomorrow, WSNIMA would have to shutter right along with them because they are the primary reason we exist. Of course, the financial and fraternal health of our lodges is critical to Mooseheart, Moosehaven, and Moose International, so we exist for them also, but there would be no structural need for us without our lodges.

What I am saying here is that there needs to be more discussion between our lodge leaders and

WSNIMA leaders. We need to come to the table and be re-

spectful and courteous, but also honest and frank about how WSNIMA could be helping our lodges succeed. We are supposed to achieve this through our District Presidents structure. I am not saying that system is broken. What I am saying is that the WSNIMA board (including the DPs) needs to come to your table ready to talk about your needs while they are honest and open about what we can and can't help with, either by rule or by bandwidth/capability.

We have a lot of ability to help our lodges, especially in the areas of fundraising, training, and sharing information like best practices, how to recruit lodge officers, etc. What we have not done in a long time is to sit down and ask lodge officers what they think WSNIMA can do that would help them most and then have a conversation about it. I believe that if we start talking, we will see real results emerge that we can all see and be proud of.

I have brought this idea to the WSNIMA Board for consideration. I promise you that I will champion something to come out of this with them. It may not be exactly this. All of them are bright.
